Three Steps: Identify - Model - Teach Your Values

1. Story Telling:

- **a.** From books

- 3. Create Routines: this reinforces values and habits (form your habit/they form you)

- 6. Allowance: use allowance to teach financial and stewardship values
- 7. **Gold Slips:** child experiences immediate positive & negative consequences when values are enacted (Gold Slips are a reward system with corresponding prizes given when a certain # are reached.)
